This organization is not formed for profit and none of its assets shall be used for the pecuniary gain or profit of any individual who is or may become a member thereof.

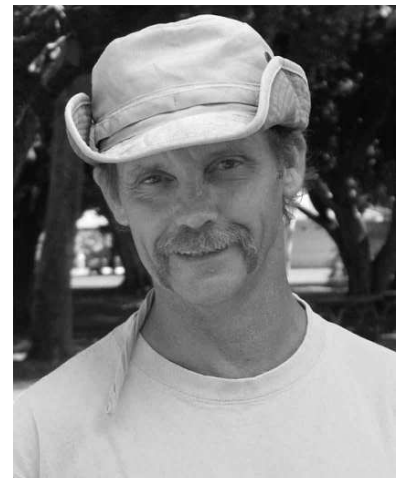

Long-time Searcher member Allen Silverstein passed away on Sunday, December 4, 2005 at the age of 82. Allen had undergone a yearlong battle with leukemia, but ultimately he died of a brain injury caused by a fall on his way to a show to do what he loved best, sell rocks and minerals.

Allen's passions were travel and collecting, particularly rocks and native American art. He began his rock collection 15 years ago after falling in love with some agate slabs in a store at Death Valley. His specialty was fluorescent minerals and he was a member of the Fluorescent Mineral Society as well as the Searchers. Each year he delighted visitors to our annual Searchers Show with his spectacular displays of fluorescent minerals and it was always a treat to have him speak at a Searchers General Meeting. Many people will miss the cases he entered in shows across the United States.

A lesson that Allen taught his friends and family and that can be applied to all walks of life, not just minerals, is that 'looking at something in a different light can completely change one's perception of it'.

With symbolism appropriate for an avid rockhound, Allen was buried with one of his favorite ammonites and mourners tossed in polished stones along with the shovelfuls of dirt as he was laid to rest. May he rest in peace.
