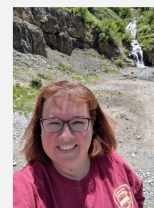

6. What is your wish for the Searchers? For the club to grow in membership. For all members to get to know each other better and share in the fellowship of this wonderful hobby that we enjoy.

### Show Committee Update

The Show Committee is pleased to announce that we are arranging for a food truck to provide food service to our 2020 show. Since the kitchen requires 4 volunteers at all times, much effort to plan and prep, and a large capital outlay for a very small return, this will reduce our need for volunteer staffing and make planning and staffing the show much easier. Additionally, due to the Orange County Health Department food guidelines, Searchers will only be selling bottled water, canned sodas, and pre-packaged snacks. We're in the process of doing research and revising our show budget to reflect the change in food service.

According to the Searchers By-Laws

- Expenditures between \$200.00 and \$1000.00 shall be presented to the board for approval.
- All expenditures over \$1000.00 shall be presented to the membership for approval.

Show-related expenditures that need approval from the membership are:

Facility rental: \$2,432

Table rental: \$1,050 (estimate)

Security: \$1,500 (estimate)

These will be presented at the October, 2019 meeting.

Please keep in mind that the show needs silent auction materials (this is our biggest fundraising event at the show), and prizes large and small, for adults and children. If you are making something, make one for the show! If every member volunteered for 2 hours for both days of the show and donated a prize, we would be in very good shape for the show. Since the Searchers is a volunteer-run organization, and non-profit, our show is our main source of fundraising.

The next show committee meetings are Saturday, October 5 and Saturday, November 9, 2019, 1-2:30 p.m., in the Anaheim Community Center in the Senior Center, past the workshop through the large wooden gate.

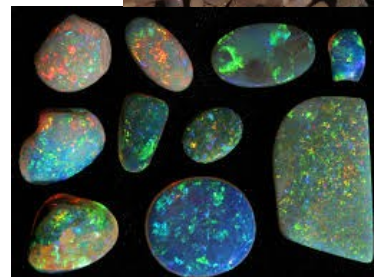
