SPECIAL THANKS TO MIKE KOKINOS

As you read in last month's Bulletin, the non-profit tax status issue has been resolved. The effort started mid year 1994, when the California Franchise Tax Board revoked the tax exempt status of three CFMS societies. CFMS immediately got involved. Mike Kokinos, CFMS Tax Advisor sent out an alert and offered his advice and quidance to all CFMS societies.

Mike's expertise includes a couple of years managing the California Franchise Tax Board Exempt Organization Unit and supervised another couple of years. This background gave him an excellent understanding of the processes, procedures and contacts necessary to determine a societies tax status and needed changes to avoid revocation of exempt status and payment of back taxes.

In July Mike's help was solicited and his response was immediate. He was sent all available information concerning our exemption status. Mike's advice and guidance was instrumental in leading the Searchers through the maze of procedures and process necessary to change the California taxation code assures our tax exempt status.

Mike provided the council necessary to rapidly complete this task and at no other cost to the Searchers than payment of his phone calls totaling \$8.28. CFMS charged us nothing for his services, however they suggested a donation to the CFMS Endowment Fund.

Through Mike's expertise and support the Searchers avoided cost of financial and/or tax advisors necessary to achieve the successful results in this matter. In appreciation of Mike's efforts, which were clearly above and beyond the responsibilities of the CFMS Tax Advisor, the Board has approved a donation of \$100 to the CFMS Endowment Fund in his honor.

ASTERISM IN GEMSTONES:

Asterism is the display of a mobile star of light on top of the dome of a stone when cut as a cabochon. It is an optical effect caused by the reflection of light by fibers, needles or channels oriented in various definite directions. The star is usually 6-rayed, but may be 4-rayed or rarely, 12 rayed. Some stone that display asterism are:

Corundum - (ruby, sapphire) may be 6 or 12 rayed stars.

Diopside - black colored stone with 4-rayed star.

Rose Quartz - pink shades may be translucent with 4-6- or 12 rayed stars.

Chrysoberyl - rarely, green shade transparent 6-rayed stars.

Garnet - almadine 4 - or 6 rayed stars.

Quartz - white gray transparent to translucent with 6-rayed star.

Beryl, Enstatite - brown black with 6-rayed star.

The rough crystal of corundum, producing such a stone, consists of three sets of series of parallel silk inclusions (rutile needles) each extending throughout the stone and intersecting each other at angles of 60 degrees. These inclusions are parallel to the lateral axis of the crystal and at right angles to the vertical axis. The stone is cut into a cabochon so that the silk is parallel to the girdle plane of the stone. The vertical axis of the stone passes through the top at the point where the silks intersect.

If the cabochon orientation is incorrect the star will be off-center and the effect less obvious. The stars of other materials are similarly produced, but the sets of silk occur in other crystallographic directions; e.g. in garnet, parallel to the sides of the dechedron.

Safety doesn't mean personal safety only, but also safety for your property. We all know about the safety of materials brought to shows, but we also tend to forget about the possibility of loss until it happens.

It happened at our show in 1995. Someone took the liberty of pilfering tools and material from one of our dealers.

Rockhounds as a whole are a great group of honest people. I think this lulls us into a sense of being secure; however, the people around a show are not all rockhounds. The Tucson Police Department published "Gem Show Safety Tips". It has many valuable ideas and should be read by everyone to refresh their memory. All of their ideas are good common sense. We all know about these things, but we must be "safety conscious".

I have seen shows clear everyone out at quitting time and then allow only those with proper identification to reenter to open cases and remove the displays. However, at that time, a back door—big enough to drive a truck through—was wide open with no one on duty to check anyone who might enter.

Do you have a dinner for dealers and exhibitors? Do you have people assigned to be sure all booths and open cases are safe during this time. These are the types of things you must think about.

I'm sure there are dozens of other items that you will cover if you are "safety conscious". If your efforts are not needed, GREAT! You are having a safe, pleasant show.


