

MAY BIRTHSTONE Emerald

The Gachala Emerald is one of the largest gem emeralds in the world, at 858 carats (172 g). This stone was found in 1967 at La Vega de San Juan mine in Gachalá, Colombia. It is housed at the National Museum of Natural History of the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C.

Emerald is regarded as the traditional birthstone for May, as well as the traditional gemstone for the astrological signs of Taurus, Cancer and sometimes Gemini. One of the quainter anecdotes on emeralds was by the 16th-century historian Brantôme, who referred to the many impressive emeralds the Spanish under Cortez had brought back to Europe from Latin America. On one of Cortez's most notable emeralds he had the text engraved Inter Natos Mulierum non sur-rexit mayor ("Among those born of woman there hath not arisen a greater," Matthew 11:11) which referred to John the Baptist. Brantôme considered engraving such a beautiful and simple product of nature sacrilegious and considered this act the cause for Cortez's loss of an extremely precious pearl (to which he dedicated a work, A beautiful and incomparable pearl), and even for the death of King Charles IX of France, who died soon after.

MAY FIELD TRIP

May 14 - 15, 2011 Buffington Pockets, Nevada Leader Jim McGeough

The May 14 - 15 trip, led by Jim McGeough, is to Buffington Pockets, about 35 miles north of Las Vegas. This site has very pretty clear blue Agate nodules. We have also found chalcedony and some fluorescent minerals so you may want to bring a black light if you have on. We have only explored a little, so there may well be other finds as the weekend progresses. If you have any questions call Steve Duncan at 714-724-7102 or email wsd@iteris.com

This is a dry camp, bring everything you will need. This late in the year it could be very hot, don't forget lots of water and sunscreen and hats. For people that don't plan to stay in camp it would seem like Vegas is the obvious choice for accommodations. We will have our usual potluck on Saturday night.

The collecting needs a high clearance vehicle at least, some areas may be sandy, and 4 wheel drive would come in handy. We will know more about the actual collecting plans at camp; if 4x4s are needed we will carpool as necessary. Standard rockhound tools are needed, starting with a rock pick and spray bottle. Depending on where we end up some more serious tools (geo pick, small sledge, Gad etc.) may be helpful. This site is described in Gem Trails of Nevada.

Directions:

Take I15 north out of Vegas for ~35 miles to exit 35. Exit here and proceed southward on the road to the Valley of Fire State Park. At 3 miles the paved road veers to the left, and a dirt road continues straight ahead. Do not veer left; instead continue straight ahead onto the dirt road. There will be a Searchers sign here. A few miles later you reach the camp; there will be another sign here. All vehicles should be able to make it to this point.

BENCH TIPS

SOLDERING EARPOSTS

I don't solder enough earposts to develop the dexterity for holding the wire by hand. So I modified a set of locking tweezers to help with the job. It's quick and easy.

Use a triangular file to make a notch at the tweezer tip to keep the wire from moving around, and file a groove in the tweezer body to rest the tweezers on a stand that keeps the earpost wire at the right angle. The stand is just soldered up from scrap copper or nickel.



This way the tweezers act like a see-saw that's weighted just a little bit more on the soldering end. I felt that if the tweezers put too much pressure on the earpost wire, it could buckle when the wire gets up to soldering temperature.

LOWERING THE NOISE

A simple way to cut down the noise when you're hammering on your mini anvil or bench block is to place it on an old mouse pad or other similar rubber material.
