To clean obsidian needles, wash them in Castile soap, using a toothbrush to get the clay off. Never put obsidian in detergent as it leaves a white film on the stone which is very hard to remove. To remove iron stains, soak them in an oxalic acid bath. Wash well.


STODDARD WELLS TAILGATE:

WHAT IS A TAILGATE? It all began about 16 years ago when the Victor Valley Gem and Mineral Club began hosting a free field trip and sale at Stoddard Wells collecting area. The Tailgate is open to all clubs and rockhounds. Everyone is allowed to sell or buy just about anything. Most items for sale are related to gems, minerals findings, and other related things, but you never know what you will see. The area is also noted for its abundance of rocks for collecting.

CAMPING: This is a dry camp area, so bring in your own water and other necessities. Supplies are available at the Bell Mountain service road. Roads are desert dirt and can handle motorhomes with no problem.

GEM AND MINERAL COLLECTING: Verde Antique, Green & Black Jade collecting areas are withing walking distance from the Tailgate. The Verde Antique is in float and in a quarry. Jade with magnatite inclusions can be found in seams. Digging tool are need for the better materials. A Field Trip on Saturday will take collectors to the nearby Sidewinder Mountains to find Tri-colored Marble which ranges from greys to dark green. A four wheel drive is advised for this trip.

BAKE SALE: There will be a Pie Booth with many delicious baked goods available throughout the Tailgate. This will be hosted by the Victor Valley Gem and Mineral Club.

MARCH FIELD TRIP

For the March Field Trip we will be camping at Kramer Junction (see map attached) on March 30th and 31st.

This date was selected to allow us to take a field trip to the U.S. Borax mine near Boron. Years ago they allowed trips every weekend, but now only in conjunction with the Tailgate event and show at Boron. On this field trip, company personnel take you to the dump where you are allowed to collect any material you find. Materials include Ulexite, Colemanite, Kernite and many less common and relatively rare minerals. Tools for this trip should include sledges and chisels for breaking boulders to find the vugs. It used to be that safety glasses were also required.

I will be receiving information on the time of the field trip to U.S. Borax as well as information for anyone in the Searchers wanting to put a case in their show, or participate in the Tailgate selling event.

On the alternate day from the U.S. Borax trip, agate materials can be dug for or picked up within walking distance of the camp site.




