The President's Message

Hello fellow Searchers

I want to let you know about some of what your board of directors is doing. We are in the process of finalizing the location for the annual Searchers year end banquet. It will be at a different venue than the most recent years. Details will be released shortly.

An update to the Workshop Rules is in work to give more members the opportunity to use the machines without having to arrive early or wait too long. In making these changes, the board has had to consider the purpose of having a work-



shop, and whether the existing rules advanced that purpose. In spite of collecting a modest fee for use of the workshop, it is still one of the biggest drains on our finances, so it is imperative that we get the most value for our investment, and that means participation by the most members.

We are processing an amendment to the Standing Rules to remove the requirement that our annual financial audit be performed by a qualified professional auditor or CPA. By allowing the board to select an otherwise qualified individual to perform the audit it will save us money and bring our practices in line with the best practices of other similar organizations. The amendment may be adopted by a majority vote of those members present at a regular monthly membership meeting after a minimum onemonth notice is given. The notice will be sent to the membership via email and will also be announced at a membership meeting at least one month prior to scheduling a vote.

To reassure our members that we are committed to integrity and transparency, I would like to remind the membership that Article IX, section 1 of our bylaws state that "All books and records of the Corporation may be inspected by any member or member's agent or attorney for any proper purpose at any reasonable time."

The board is currently searching for a new Asset Manager. Anyone willing to step up and take on this role will receive the help of the board as well as of the current Asset Manager. Lydia has done a fantastic job of organizing our property and the storage space to make it easier to manage so now is a good time to transfer this task to another member. Anyone interested can contact myself or any board member.

No Field trips this month instead a: Field Trip Exploration

After running across some information online about fossil sites near Ventura, we set off to scout out a possible field trip. The site near Coyote Creek and the Ventura River didn't mention poison oak nor the many houses built nearby. Even after examining the road cuts carefully, I didn't find a single fossil. We tried to find access to the mountains on the south side of the Ventura River but they were either fenced oilfield land or private property. The 101/150 fossil site was not very exciting, so we gave up and went to the beach. We found free parking and beach access (path can be steep at the bottom) at the Carpentaria Bluffs Nature Preserve, just south of the Seal Sanctuary, and north of Rincon Point. I found several fossils such as aggregates of small shells and a larger rock of oyster shells. This was a tar mining site and we found



plenty on the beach. This is a beautiful, rocky, shallow beach meant for low tide access. (The Seal Sanctuary is closed September 1-May 1 for pup season.) There are no facilities or water. I would recommend this as beachcombing destination. We were able to clean off our feet without problem when we got home. The only Ventura River access we found was up near Ojai. Do you have any rock adventures you would like to share or field trips to recommend? If so, send them in to Doug for the Rock Slab.


