South Orange County is scheduled to be separated from the 714 area code into a new 949 code, perhaps as early as October 18th, six months ahead of the planned April 18, 1998 split. The exact boundary of the 714 split is not yet available but it will probably be near the county's geographical center, with the 949 code serving customers south to the San Diego County border. Pacific Bell officials said several communities along the planned 714/949 split will be served by both codes.



SEARCHER FIELD TRIP MAP ANZA BORREGO









 COME EARLY AND LISTEN TO OUR CHOIR PRACTICE.



WHAT IS A TAILGATE? It all began about 16 years ago when the Victor Valley Gem and Mineral Club began hosting a free field trip and sale at Stoddard Wells collecting area. The Tailgate is open to all clubs and rockhounds. Everyone is allowed to sell or buy just about anything. Most items for sale are related to gems, minerals findings, and other related things, but you never know what you will see. The area is also noted for its abundance of rocks for collecting.

CAMPING: This is a dry camp area, so bring in your own water and other necessities. Supplies are available at the Bell Mountain service road. Roads are desert dirt and can handle motorhomes with no problem.

GEM AND MINERAL COLLECTING: Verde Antique, Green & Black Jade collecting areas are withing walking distance from the Tailgate. The Verde Antique is in float and in a quarry. Jade with magnatite inclusions can be found in seams. Digging tool are need for the better materials. A Field Trip on Saturday will take collectors to the nearby Sidewinder Mountains to find Tri-colored Marble which ranges from greys to dark green. A four wheel drive is advised for this trip.

BAKE SALE: There will be a Pie Booth with many delicious baked goods available throughout the Tailgate. This will be hosted by the Victor Valley Gem and Mineral Club.
