## SHOW July 3, 4, 5, 1998 Monterey Fairgrounds

### HIGHLIGHTS - APRIL GENERAL MEETING:

Meeting called to order at 7:45 PM

President Cliff Warner was present but due to a bout of laryngitis Herb Beckman conducted this evenings meeting.

Audrey Nichols introduced our program presenters for this evening Corliss and John Rose.

Milly Arvanites Arvanites distributed our 1998 Membership Roster (before her allergies kicked in and she left for the Emergency Room) so if you didn't get yours at the meeting they'll be available at the April meeting. Milly is doing fine. They got it under control and she was able to go home later in the evening.

Larry Richey, Veterans Coordinator, has returned to the Vet's workshop after an absence of five weeks due to workload problems at his regular job. Larry reported on the Vet's "People Contest", i.e., they were asked to create a person using rocks. They had 14 excellent entries. All of these items will be displayed in the Vet's cases during our Annual Show. Tools for use in their contest were donated by the California Crippled Veterans.

Show Chairman, Milt Green, reported that Donation Award Tickets are available for pick up this evening. Please see Roger Cole. Each member is asked to please purchase \$10.00 worth of tickets to either sell or keep for yourselves. If you do not pick them they will be mailed to members. Please pick them up to save postage.

Milt and Beth Pelfrey announced that Show Flyers are available again this evening and urged everyone to take some to pass to friends, relatives, places of business and in and around your workplace.

## HIGHLIGHTS - APRIL GENERAL MEETING (Cont'd):

Committee Chairpersons circulated their clipboards asking members to sign up and help during the show. We'll need help in Security, Kitchen/Serving, Crafts, Children's Jewelry, Friday Night Dinner, Donation Awards. Membership and Hospitality times are filled but check with the chairpersons. Be sure to see Walter Mroch and sign up to put your case in our show.

We'll need pies and cakes for Saturday and Sunday so please get your name on the clipboard. Our last Show Meeting will be in April.

We need to wear our badges during the show. If you don't have a badge, see George Mitchum. The price is \$5.00.

Margaret Neeley reported that the new Senior Center is moving along and will be ready for occupancy possibly July or August. Clubs that are scheduled to have space in the new Center will be notified. The Arts Council will be holding their Annual Soiree on May 8th. The Searchers have in the past helped out during the event in addition to buying a table for the event at \$500 plus donating a piece of fine jewelry. Like everything, prices have gone up. This year the price of a table for 10 is \$75 per person or \$750. However a table of 8 would be \$600. We've not been asked for a piece of jewelry.

Nancy Norlund asked for volunteers to serve refreshments during the May, July, August and September meetings. Nancy also announced that the Santa Ana Club has 17 (fold-up type) showcases for sale. The price is \$30.00 each. If anyone is interested sign up or give Nancy and Jerry a call.

Max Johnson, Public Lands, read a report that requesting that all members contact their Congressional members urging the re-opening of roads and trails in the forests and public lands. "The Public Lands for People Organization" held a peaceful demonstration (in the rain) during which 400 people visited George Brown of Colton, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) in Riverside and others showing support of this re-opening. He said the Charter Mining Company has been fighting for the reversal for five years. The suit went to the Supreme Court and the International Court. The orginal ruling has been reversed. The company is to go up next week to reclaim the land.

Herb Beckman, Workshop Coordinator, reported that sealed bids will be accepted at the April General meeting for the 16 inch drop saw and two disc cabbing unit. These were designed by Carl Pitzler who wants them to go to someone who will put them to good use. Units may be seen at the workshop.

Manny Sandico circulated a sign-up sheet for <u>his</u> workshop. He will be teaching stone setting, jewelry repair, casting, etc. He also has videos on these subjects. Advanced casting will also be taught. Herb Beckman invited him to hold the classes at the workshop.

Jay Cole has all types of lost wax and other materials. If interested please see him at the Victorville Tailgate, March 20 - 22nd. Marie Cole reminded everyone of the corned beef and cabbage potluck at 4:00 PM Saturday, March 21st at Victorville campout.

Nancy Norlund invited members to the Santa Ana Rock Club meeting, Thursday, 12 March. Walter Mroch will be their guest speaker and the subject is Topaz.

Meeting adjourned at 10:32 PM.

#### CUTTING PLUME AGATE:

Want to try something different and beautiful? First, pick out a good grade of White Plume Agate and slice it thinner than usual, but thick enough to bevel. Then cut slabs of black jasper as thin as possible. Boil the slices to remove oil. Epoxy the jasper to the underside of the White Plume. Press together and rub slightly to get the bubbles out and then weight it down or clamp it together until it dries. Mark and cut the same way you would regular cabochons. These are stunning and you will surely want to cut more.
