PICNIC - PICNIC - PICNIC:



SHOP HINTS:

After obsidian is sawed, be sure to bevel the edges all around on your fine grinding wheel to keep the chips from flaking and chipping. Wear glasses or goggles at all times. This procedure is to prevent the possibility of getting small chips of glass in your eye, as obsidian is easily chipped, and the tiny chips fly all around.
