ROCKHOUNDING APPS

Last month I reported on a cool app for Android phones called "BackCountry Navigator" that allowed using your Android phone or tablet to plot your location on a US Topo map (or several others kinds of maps) – even if you have no cell signal. In fact, even if the device is not part of a cell contract so long as the device has a working GPS antenna and you download the map area in advance. You can find the app on the Google Play Store.

While the Topo maps and others are filled with information such as dirt roads, trails, hills and valleys and old mine sites, you can add your own waypoint info to preserve those "special" trips and the app can also import waypoint info from other sources using standard mapping code. Many folks document their discoveries and publish them online. There is a wealth of info on YouTube and the internet on what's available and how to import.

This month I want to draw your attention to another app you might find useful. It uses data from mindat, the USGS and other sources to show old (and current) mines on a map. The app is called Digger's Map, and it's available on IOS and Android. They advertise more than 300,000 locations of 60+ minerals – although only 16 are included free. There are locations for gold, iron, copper, platinum, gemstones, marble, tungsten, quartz, etc. You choose what mineral you wish to seek and it loads the locations of mines that produced that material whether closed or still operating. Selecting the location you're interested in gives a brief explanation of what's at that site, and tapping for more will link the USGS mindat data for that particular mine.

Used with the previous BackCountry Navigator app, you can find your way there and back easily. This app is available through the Google Play Store or the AppStore with Apple.


