

Castle Butte Field Trip Report – Dec 6-7, 2025

The Searchers' last visit to the Castle Butte area in the western Mojave was 2 years ago. The visit in early December had all new trippers with the exception of the leaders for a total of 12 on Saturday, half of which were there for just the day. And who could blame them with the temperature dropping to the low 30's at night! However the weather was beautifully clear and not windy, with a near full moon. The desert camping experience with friends is a large part of the allure of these trips.

Saturday brought us to the famous Sierra Pelona Banded Travertine Onyx claim owned by the Santa Clarita club of the same name. This claim has been visited hundreds of times for many years and still continues to produce beautiful specimens banded in greens, reds, grays, black and white. Not only is this material colorful, it takes a good polish, too.

The seam was probably visible on the surface decades ago, but now the good material is 4-6 ft down. Fortunately the overburden is usually mostly removed by visiting rockhounds and the seam is still very productive. Unfortunately we were there shortly after a couple of flood-worthy storms that filled in the diggings with a lot of sand. The true rockhounds dug right in (pun intended). And, as we always do, we backfilled enough so small critters like tortoises can find their way out if they fall in.

After lunch we moved on to a new area scouted a few weeks ago with large pieces of jasper and agate in hills of basalt. The new rockhound trippers were having a blast. The clear, cool, windless weather allowed for beautiful views on our way back to camp where we said adios to those not camping. We prepared a potluck, sat around a campfire for a while and went to bed early.

Sunday took the remaining six to the foothills of Castle Butte, stopping in several spots for more jasp-agate material. The rumored bloodstone was only found in one or two very, very small chips, and we're still interpreting whether we found petrified bog and petrified wood. But we did see some desert vistas, did some 4x4 hill climbing, and visited some anonymous desert artwork. Everyone had a good time and left for home Sunday afternoon with plenty of material.
