



After having two tentative sites fall through because of changes brought on by last year's storms we are going to revisit a site that's easy to get to and will afford plenty of nice colored jasper and agate float and larger if you wish to dig it out. We'll also have opportunities for petrified palm, and petrified wood, colorful chalcedony, bog agate and palm, and maybe even some of Doug's fabled Black Agate. We will be camping, but this is also doable as a day-trip or by using some nearby hotel/motels.

Most locations are near the camp (<2 miles). Although the Early Man Site has been closed for some time, we will be collecting near there and also at the Green Ash Hills area nearby. After that we take Mule Canyon Road a ways to the Bog and Black agate and traverse to surface collection at Tin Can Alley. High clearance vehicles required, and four wheel drive is HIGHLY recommended due to some long stretches of deep sand. This trip will involve off road driving.

The meeting point and camp location is just off of the 15 freeway at the Minneola Rd exit just east of Yermo. After exiting the freeway, go north toward the Shell station and loop around it travel east parallel to the 15 Fwy. About a quarter mile past the Shell, look for the Searcher Sign and take the dirt road on the left barely 100 yards to the camp site. This is a dry camp, so bring plenty of water and fire wood. For those not camping, there are hotels and RV parks 5 miles away in Yermo as well as 15 miles away in Barstow. Gas is a half mile from camp at the Shell station which also has a convenience store, and Eddie World is 5 miles away boasting the largest gas station in California as well as numerous restaurants and convenience stores.

We will have a typical Searcher Potluck on Saturday evening.

We'll meet at 8:30am and leave at 9:00. I hope you all can join!




The Pow Wow was about 1/4 its usual self; there were many empty stalls. But the exhibits inside were so interesting and well done. The display cases showing various kinds of rock found on the daily field trips run by the local club were particularly beautiful. We all liked the pine-needle woven baskets with tumbled stone centers that the local club had made. We were able to enjoy



3 dinners out together. The breakfast that the club puts on at the Pow Wow was very good. On Friday, we headed to Desert Gardens to look for geodes for our geode cracking activity at our show. Desert Gardens had similar vacancies. We figured that international dealers must have to make arrangements so far in advance that COVID has made planning difficult. One dealer told us that some were leaving early for Tucson. Looking for geodes for the Searcher Show, we had two choices for geodes: Mexican or Moroccan. We even braved the frenzied buyers at Gem World without finding another viable geode option with Elaine

and Bill helping look at all of the choices. We chose the Moroccan and bought around 115 geodes, in approximately 3 sizes. These are the "coconut" kind with the caramel-colored rind and bright white quartz crystals on the inside. We think that kids will be super impressed with the sparkles, but we're not sure if they will crack nicely or if they will break up. We'll see.

We went out and looked at the BLM campsites on the southeast side of Quartzite (Scadden Wash) and we think that we'll probably camp there next time. It's a little further from the free-

Did You Know?


The earth's inner core, a dense, iron-rich spinning body, is about 1,520 miles across and about as hot as the sun's surface. It is surrounded by the liquid outer core of the earth. This core may be spinning, but at a different speed than the earth's surface. Seismologists have found evidence that the inner core's spin can both speed up and slow down. It is thought that the earth's magnetic field, which is generated by

the earth's liquid outer core, is pulling at the inner core, causing it to spin. These tugging forces have been found to change the direction



and speed of the earth's core about every 70 years. This is nothing to worry about. Details are still being worked out by scientists.
