The Diversity of American Gems: Western States, presented by Renee Newman. A summary follows about the gems found across the western states.

In Southern California a number of pegmatite minerals are found including: blue cap tourmalines, kunzite, morganite, aquamarine and lepidolite. Northern California is noted for the state's gem, benitoite. Also found are abalone and scallop pearls, californite (also called Happy Camp jade) and nephrite jade from Big Sur.

Arizona is noted for its copper. Turquoise, azurite, malachite, chrysocolla and gem silica. Also found is ant-hill garnet, amethyst, peridot and fire agate. New Mexico is famous for Kelly blue smithsonite.






