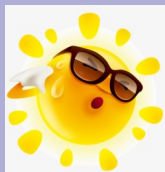

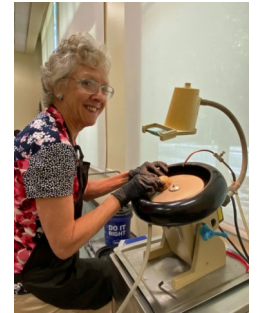

### Presentation:

The presentation was given by Tina White about the Geology of Stoddard Wells.

The ground beneath Stoddard Wells was created by the Farallon Plate diving beneath the continental plate (subduction). A Batholith was formed with many volcanoes and igneous intrusions creating granite. There are Mesozoic remnants in the Southern Mojave. Cima Dome and Pishah Crater are younger than even these.

The Stoddard Wells geography is mostly granite made from felsic porphyry which is a fine-grained matrix with larger crystals. It is lighter in color from feldspar and silica. There is also some schistose porphyry which has been metamorphosed from the felsic variety. It is darker in color. In the area is also rhyolitic quartz latite, piedmontite and tourmalinated quartz.

Collectable materials include: black jade, blue dolomite, tricolor marble, Verde-antique marble and soapstone.
