History of Quartzsite, AZ

In 1856, settler Charles Tyson built a fort at the present site of Quartzsite to protect his water supply. Fort Tyson soon became a stopover on the Ehrenburg-to-Prescott stagecoach route, eventually becoming known as Tyson's Wells. After the stage stopped running, it became a ghost town.

A small mining boom revitalized the town and it became known as Quartzsite in 1897. It remained a mining town until 1965, when the Pow Wow Rock, Gem & Mineral Show initiated the rockhound winter migration to Quartzsite each year. These days, the population can swell to almost a million during January and February as rockhounders, jewelers and vendors, mostly in thousands of RVs, attend the eight major gem and mineral shows.

Population & Elevation

Quartzsite 3,714 people / 876 feet above sea level

Weather and Climate

Quartzsite has a classic low desert climate with extremely low relative humidity and very high summer temperatures. On the average, it receives less than 4 inches of precipitation a year. Stores, shops, restaurants, theaters and homes are air-conditioned year round in Quartzsite. June, July, August and September temperatures are in the 100 plus ranges.

Field Trip Report—December 15th, 16th 2023 Cadys

Our scheduled Field Trip to the North Cady's was a good introduction to the plentiful supplies and various mineral varieties in the 'Top Notch' area. On Friday, Jeremy Berg offered a view of the surrounding landscape and described his search techniques for discovery of different plume and jasper (in matrix) buried under hard rock, whereby a 'calcite spear' seam was encountered on the sur-



face. He was a valuable guide to the surrounding collection areas. We also visited the TN Fluorite mine where green, and purple fluorite specimens were hammered out of the top of the mine (above the adit). Corey and Caleb chunked out a bucket of Fluorite pieces to share with everyone.

On Saturday AM, we used my Garmin device to identify Doug Flaugh's coordinates for charting our routes to the area of 'Jewelry Box' and 'Honey Pot', sitting side by side.

Up in the canyon and around the surrounding hills we discovered abundant chalcedony nodules and crystals, seam agates, travertine, sagenite, all of various combinations.

Friday and Saturday night campfire chats kept us warm and thankful as we shared stories and food. We had half a dozen for Friday night and up to almost 20 people in eight different vehicles during events for Saturday. Desert trekking can be challenging, except for the help from hardy souls, Jeremy and Ed. Sunday's trip to the 'old mining camp' of 'Bob's Cave Room' and further exploration into North Cady's will have to wait.

For future trips, I want to check out Pyramid mountain, and Candy Cane clane (Jeremy), and a site Caleb said we missed. The greatest part of the journey was the 'jewelry box' of personalities we were blessed with on our trip!!!
