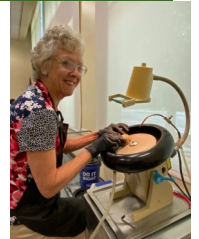

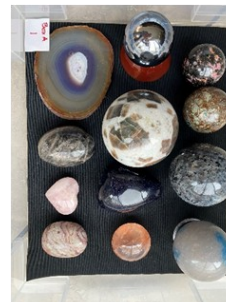
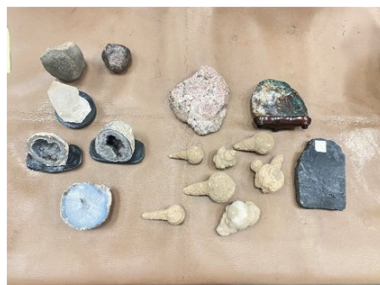

Minutes from General Meeting, February 11, 2025

Meeting location: Downtown Anaheim Community Center

Call to Order: The meeting began at 6:30 PM by Robin Larzelere

Show cases: We encourage you to do one this year, with an emphasis on education. If you don't have a case, you may be able to borrow one from somebody. Searchers has a few cases that can be borrowed (or shared with other members); call Veronica Purpura for information.

Storage unit move: The move is finished now. Thanks to Margaret & Bill Hogarth, Jamie Cassidy-Curtis, Bob Rubino, and a member named "MC" (sorry, we didn't get your last name).

By-laws: We now have the 3 required members for the review committee: Bill Hogarth, Caleb Guyer, and Jamie Cassidy-Curtis, so the review will begin soon. One issue we need to review is whether junior members should pay membership fees.

Searcher Presenters and News

April Speaker: Stan Bogosian

Three Mines out of Lovelock, Nevada



Stan Bogosian will be presenting **via Zoom (only) on April 8th** as the Center is closed for maintenance.

Topic: Three Mines out of Lovelock, Nevada (Perfect Places to Collect during a Pandemic Lockdown)

In July, 2020 three members of Bay Area Mineralogists ventured out into a remote area east of Lovelock, Nevada for a socially-distanced collecting trip. We first visited the Redbird Mine, which was the primary locality for crystallized cinnabar before the deposits in China were discovered. We then proceeded out to the Lovelock and Nickel Mines in Cottonwood Canyon.

Nickel and Cobalt were mined here during the 19th and early 20th century. Nearby the Nickel Mine is the true ghost town of Bolivia, Nevada. Included will be photos of mercury, cobalt, and nickel microminerals. NOTE: this presentation should be of interest to 4X4 enthusiasts as well as rockhounds.

Bio:

Stan Bogosian was born in San Jose, California in 1952. He has been a serious field collector since 1990, and has travelled throughout the western United States in search of fine mineral specimens and lapidary material. His current interest is micro-minerals, although he has an extensive collection of rocks and minerals of all sizes, including polished rounds of Miocene petrified wood he collected in Eastern Washington. Stan graduated from Eastern Washington University, Cheney, Washington, in 1978 with a Bachelor's in Education. After teaching high school for several years in Washington and California, Stan worked as a manager in the private sector until his retirement in 2013.

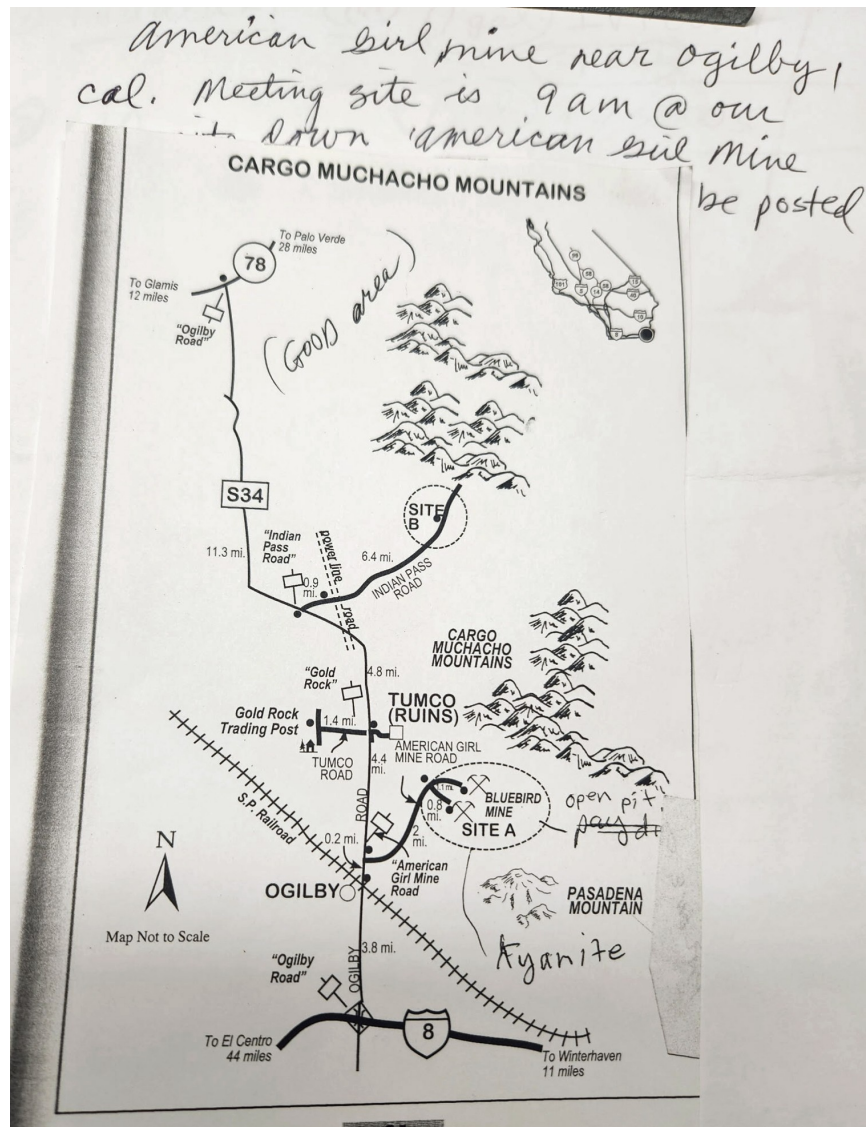

March Field Trip Report from Burro Creek

Hello fellow Searchers and rockhounds; once again we have descended on the Burro Creek area on 3 07-09 2025.

We camped at a dry camping site with plenty of room, a mile and a half behind the 'Nothing' sign off the 93 hwy (seven miles south of BC campground).



Rain came Friday nite with heavy frost on Saturday morning. Alva Richardson, from Quartzite Gem and mineral Roadrunner club came by @ 9am with a sample of polished specimens before our journey began. Robert and Sharon Burson also had some beautiful polished samples. We left the campsite w/ ten cars and 24 people in a journey to 5 different sites, following a well maintained dirt road traveling 5 miles in (nr Bagdad mine), 5 miles back, then 3 miles out again to a multi colored pastelite area with amazing bright and colorful jasper agates too numerous to collect. Our stops were many bentonite rich hill sided that gave way to different sized rocks that would give clues to their intricate workings but not easy to spot. Breaking a corner off would help but still elusive on it's beautiful contents.



Sunday, Steve Duncan led us to another 5 sites, 'the cattle ranch', Clay Hills site, and three others through upper Burro Creek with 8" of water, alongside white clay bentonite rich hill-sides exposed by erosion. Surface collecting was fun through the dry washes and short cliffs. Buried often under a thin layer of white ash were good specimens of transparent Chalcedony, Indricate, lace seam agate w/some ledge lavender seams.



Weather was perfect and Saturday night potluck and campfire was full of fun and cheer from our two clubs. The thrilling mystery of slab cuts from rocks collected there were semi transparent with some peach and lavender seams of Indricate agate, astonishingly beautiful.....Samples will be shown when we meet again, at our general meeting, or the lapidary workroom.

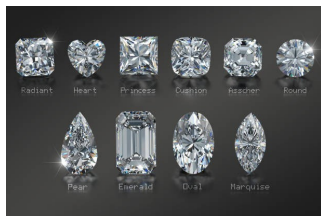
