FEDERATION REPORT:


Bruce Vento (D-Minnesota) chaired the third and last field hearing (regarding H.R. 780) of the Interior Subcommittee on National Parks and Public Lands, February 10, 1990, Beverly Hills, CA. Many other members were in attendance including Congressman Mel Levine (author H.R. 780), Congressman Jerry Lewis (author H.R. 3460).

I believe the opponents and advocates attending the hearing were evenly divided, those dressed with yellow color were for H.R. 780 and those against wearing orange or red.

Eighty-five people were permitted to speak to the Panel (45 being for the bill and the remaining 40 against). Attorney General Van de Kamp and Controller Gray Davis spoke first but avoided the subject and concentrated primarily on the oil spill. Several others who spoke implied that BLM was understaffed and improperly funded indicating that many millions of acres of the CDCA was inadequately observed with only 40 people on the staff this past year it has been an impossible job.

I believe the point was made, and Congressman Levine acknowledged that the bill was very discriminatory in that it did not include provisions for the handicapped, elderly and others who would be unable to hike and carry enough supplies for survival in most of the areas if the areas were to be declared wilderness.

At our February General Meeting we discussed plans for our extended May Field Trip.




HELPFUL HINT: When polishing metal cabs like Pyrite or Hematite, rub by hand with a chamois charged with ZAM and get a great finish.
