

For those with a historical interest the top ten collecting sites for the club are as follows: 1) Mule Canyon/Calico(18x) 2) Wiley Wells(17x) 3) Quartzsite(16x) 4) Boron, Chuckawalla, Castle Butte(11x) 5) Tick Canyon(10x) 6) Kramers Junction, Green Ash Hills/Afton Canyon, Cady Mins/Ludlow(9x) 7) Gem Hill, Last Chance Canyon(8x) 8) Lavic Siding, Stoddard Wells (7x) 9) Pala, Hector Road, Copper World, Opal Min. (6x) 10) Bagdad, Fort Irwin, Kingston Peak, Henderson/Las Vegas, Tonopah, Indian Pass/Ogilby(5x).

I am asking the membership for help in determining whether or not certain collecting localities are still open. The following are the questionable locations: Horse Canyon/O'Brien Canyon, De Luz Canyon, Kanaan Road Quarry, Truckhaven, New Poe, Shark Tooth Hill, Mecca, and Wrightwood/Guffy's Camp Please contact me if you have any access information on these sites. In addition, I plan on returning to the concept of a field trip leader for each of the planned field trips, i.e. I will be asking certain members who are familiar with specific collecting sites to act as the trip leader for the actual collecting. Where possible I will assume this role if I am familiar with the area.

As you well know, there was no field trip in December. We have the January 18-20 field trip to Stoddard Wells and the February 8-10 field trip to Quartzsite fast approaching. There will be 20 detailed handouts of possible collecting locations available on the back table at the January 17th meeting. There will also be copies of the field trip survey in case members have neglected to bring them to the meeting. Please fill them out at the meeting or mail them to my home address. I urge you to submit a completed form so that I can provide you with the collecting experiences that you want. Thank you for your help and Happy New Year!


PROGRAM REPORT:
